With objective of expeditious the digital platform transition to District/Panchayat/Taluka levels, the Govt. of India have decided to incentivise the District Collectors / DMs / Deputy Commissioners to undertake Information, Education and Communication (IEC) activities to promote digital payments for day to day financial transactions like buying and selling goods/services, transferring money etc. An incentive of Rs. 10/- will be provided to District Collectors/DMs/Deputy Commissioner for every individual who has transited to digital payment mode and has undertaken at least two successful transactions by any of the five methods of digital payment listed below: OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY Unified Payment Interface (UPI): (i) USSD (*99# banking); (ii) (iii) Aadhar Enabled payments; (iv) Wallets and Rupay/Debit/Credit / Prepaid Cards (v) Despatched NITI Aayog will be immediately transferring amounts upto Rs 5 lakhs per District based on population figures. This amount may be utilised as seed money to kick-start the activity. Secretary, MEITY has separately written to District Collectors regarding the utilisation of Common Service Network to mobilise citizens and merchants to go cashless. MEITY has announced an incentive of Rs. 100/- to CSE operator for every merchant enabled to transact digitally and Rs. 5/- to CSE operator per citizen enrolled to the Digital Payment System. As you are aware, MEITY/CSE SPV has already provided two resource persons in each District Collectorate to coordinate the CSE network in your District. The District Collectors may be directed to immediately mobilise the services of CSE network. In case you require any further assistance, please get in touch with Ms. Aruna Sundararajan, Secretary, MEITY at secretary, meity@gov.in Achievement of the purpose means seeding of Aadhar and Mobile numbers to the Bank Account, issue of Rupay Cards where necessary, issue of PIN where necessary, downloading of App where necessary and finally achieving two successful transactions. The top ten (10) Best Performing Districts of India will be awarded the Digital Payment Champions of India Award by NITI Aayog/Government of India. You may also like to closely coordinate and interact with the Panchayats. The first fifty (50) Panchayats which go cashless will be awarded the Digital Payment Award of Honour by NITI Aayog/Government of India.2.,

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- 5. I have had the opportunity to interact on video-conference with Chief Secretaryies on low-cost, convenient digital payment options available and the need to make digital payments a mass-movement. Digital payments and the use of technology can help create a fair, just and transparent system. Use of technology will bring transparency and unprecedented accountability at every end. Common people will be the biggest beneficiaries of this change.
- 6. These payment options can be used by all sections of Indians with and without bank accounts, and with even very basic mobile phones. I will also request you to ensure that maximum transactions in your State, District and Subordinate organizations should be on eplatform and cashless. This could be disbursements to beneficiaries, inter-organisation transfers or payment upto last mile (say labourer of the contractor). Similarly, all receivables in the State, District in any form: say user changers, penalty, fee etc. be made fully digital using any of the five methods mentioned in Para 1. As Mahatma Gandhi had said, "You must be the change you wish to see in the world". I will urge you as Chief Secretary of State to start using all transactions on digital payment and encourage others to do the same.
 - 7. To spread the Digital Payments campaign, it is vital that States assemble your 'digital armies' at the State, district and Panchayat level, leveraging all departments of the government available - from skilled youth (trained under PMKVY and allied schemes) to e-Disha centers available in districts. It is critical that we skill instructors in all forms of digital payments, and then impart training to all citizens via training camps, workshops, etc. All the creative material (Presentation/films/posters/FM radio Ads) shared on digital payments are NITI available website dedicated digital payments on Aayog 10 http://niti.gov.in/content/digital-payments. The Hindi/English version of the brochure which gives the step-by-step approach on all 5 options is also available on the website.
 - 8. On the ground, many States are already doing many innovative campaigns to help spread digital payments in your States. Please write to me at <u>cco-niti@gov.in</u> with best practices (not more than 2 pages) that you are currently implementing in your districts, so that we can share the same with all other States and Officers across India and also widely publicise and disseminate them.
 - 9. I would request you to immediately issue instructions in this regard to all the District Collectors in your State to fully utilize this scheme to spread digital literacy. Secretary (Information Technology) of your State may kindly closely monitor and supervise the implementation.
 - 10. Please also write to me with any other ideas, solutions or challenges you are facing and what the Government of India can do to provide you full assistance and support.
 - 11. We look forward to your active participation in this transformational initiative.
